Home Preparedness Scavenger Hunt

Discover how prepared your household is for an emergency by having a family scavenger hunt. Test to see if your family can find all the items on the home preparedness checklists. If you do find an item, put it in a storage container marked *Emergency Supply Kit*.

Be sure to put the container somewhere that you can get to it easily and to pack enough supplies to live on your own for at least three days.

Emergency Supply Kit

- Water:** one gallon per person per day, plus extra for pets
- Food:** food that won't go bad and a can opener
- Flashlight:** do not forget batteries
- Radio:** do not forget batteries
- Water Treatment:** Iodine tablets or unscented chlorine bleach and an eyedropper
- Phone:** a cell phone with charger
- Documents:** important papers
- Emergency Reference Card:** phone numbers for the fire department, police, hospital and family members
- Toiletries:** soap, toothbrush, toothpaste, shampoo, toilet paper
- Whistle:** to get help
- First Aid Kit:** Band-Aids, tweezers
- Cash:** bills, coins and credit cards
- Keys:** keys for the house and car
- Special Needs:** medicines and pet food
- Clothing:** extra pants, shirts, socks and underwear
- Tools:** a wrench or pliers
- Matches:** waterproof matches or matches in a waterproof container
- Mess Kits:** spoons, forks, knives and plates
- Paper and Pencil:** to write down important information
- Fire Extinguisher:** to put out any fires
- Tarp, Tent, Poncho:** to keep from getting wet
