

Emergency Supplies Kit Checklist

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An emergency supplies kit contains all the things your family needs to be self-sufficient for at least 72 hours after a disaster.

Build a kit that includes food and water, and accounts for the unique needs of children, pets, and elderly and sick family members.

Recommended kit items include:

nonperishable food (e.g., formula and pet food) potable water (one gallon per person, per day) prescription medications and eyeglasses flashlight(s) with extra batteries first aid kit battery-powered or hand-crank radio personal hygiene items (e.g., hand sanitizer and travel-size toiletries) important paperwork (e.g., passports and insurance policies) cash (e.g., small bills and loose change) manual can opener cell phone and charger wrench or pliers to turn off utilities plastic sheeting and duct tape copy of your Family Communication Plan



Make a date to check your emergency kit(s) every six (6) months. Refresh your water supply, and remove, use and replace items close to their expiration date.
